How to Play Roulette

How to Play Roulette:

Understanding the Basics

Roulette is by far the third most popular casino game worldwide, after slots and video poker. Although its origin is quite unclear, the popularity of roulette in the late 18th century, beginning with the elitists gambling palace at Monte Carlo in Monaco, is very well-known.

But what really makes roulette very popular? Well, the game of roulette is fun, easy to play, and has certain glamour attached to it. The fact that it is so easy to play means that a number of players can play roulette without having to worry about how to increase their winning potential. It is just necessary to note that the main object of the game is to pick the winning number that will appear on the roulette wheel. The player can also bet combinations of numbers or select the color or whether it is odd or even.

However, although it is said that roulette is as easy as pie, winning the roulette is not easy as it seems. In order to win the game, there are certain rules to follow and certain things to note. What these rules and worth noting things are? Let's find out.

Rules of Roulette

As I've said earlier, the game of roulette is rather uncomplicated, but this does not mean that one must not pay attention to the rules of roulette. It's a MUST, however. The players must be a bit familiar with the roulette rules before placing any sophisticated bets.

Here are the rules you should know about roulette:

The Table Minimum

The first thing you should know is how the table minimum works. For example, if you are playing at a table with a \$5 minimum, you are required to place \$5 on each of your outside bets and a total of at least \$5 on your inside bets. In this case, if you play black/red, odd/even, or high/low, it's a rule that you must place the table minimum for each and every bet. On the other hand, there's a chance for you to place five \$1 bets on five completely different inside bets, which are usually determined by specific numbers or combinations of numbers.

The Standard North American Roulette Rules

Well, before you get confused, note that the Standard North American roulette rules have the table use a number of different chips than other table games at the casino. Then, every player is assigned a different color of chip. This is what allows the dealer to differentiate bets and match them to the right players. Also, the chips are deemed worthless at the other tables in the casino, so never bother to try stacking them up under your blackjack chips or anything silly like that. The dealer of roulette will exchange your game chips for regular chips at the time you finished your game.

Value of Chip Denomination

In the game of roulette, you typically have to give some indications to the dealer as to what value of chip denomination you want to be given with. For instance, if you are playing at a \$5 minimum table, you will usually have a minimum value of \$1 on roulette chips. You can judge this value based on your average bet and whether or not you like to split things up a lot.

Note that when you obtain your roulette chips, the chips will not be marked or labeled with a denomination. You are the ones who will choose it and all of the

chips mirror that worth. The dealer of roulette, on the other hand, will keep track of this by way of associating the amount and color of the chips with a “lammer”.

Roulette Is For a More Relaxed Crowd

To play and win roulette is to know that roulette doesn't move at a quick pace. It is rather for a more relaxed crowd than you're likely to find at the craps table. As what many pros have said, the roulette rules kind of necessitate this sluggishness, as making all of the bets is what slows things down. So, when you are at the point that you want to place your bet, don't just be concerned about someone else having already taken your bet. Thank to colors that chips can share bets.

Furthermore, roulette rules provide the player lots of time to set his or her bets, and can even keep doing so after the wheel has been spun. Just don't try it after the dealer waves his hands over the table, though. Also, once the ball has found its pocket, the dealer of roulette will call out the winning number and place a clear marker on that number's spot on the table layout. What follows is that the dealer sweeps the table clean and the winner is paid. Just wait until the dealer says *“Place your bets before putting any chips down for the next spin”*.

The Roulette Wheel

There are two different forms of roulette wheel. The first is the European wheel which has 37 slots numbered 0 to 36, and the house edge is 2.63. The second type is the American wheel which has 38 numbers in the sense that a double zero is added. Note that the addition of the extra number increases the house edge to 5.26 percent.

On a standard roulette wheel, the numbers 1 through 36 are divided evenly among red and black “pockets”. The pocket is actually the container that a ball may come to rest in. In addition to the 36 red and black pockets, there are either 1 or 2 green pockets. These pockets then contain the number zero and double

zero (00) on the roulette wheel. If you will take a closer look to a standard roulette wheel, you will notice that the numbers are not distributed in a random fashion. For every number on the wheel, directly across from it is the next highest even number. Typically, the red and black alternate, and the pairs of even numbers alternate with pairs of odd numbers, with 0 and 00 exceptions.

The Layout

The game of roulette originated in France. The name itself, “roulette”, is a French word meaning “small wheel” then signifying the game as we know it today. The modern day layout of roulette we usually find in the casino actually dates back to 1842. The layouts of the game have two vetting areas. There is the inside betting area, which contains the individual numbers on the layout, and there is the outside betting area which has boxes for the columns, red or black and odd or even. There are also different groups of numbers on the outside betting area.

Speaking of numbers, it is interesting to know that the numbers on the inside betting area of the roulette layout are arranged in 12 rows of three numbers. This is what forms the three vertical columns. The zero and double zero are found at the tops of the columns.

The Betting

There are two betting options involved in the game of roulette: the inside bets and the outside bets.

The Inside Bets

In the inside bets, note that there are a number of bets that you can make under this option. You can bet a number straight up or straddle the line between numbers to select a combination of numbers.

Here are the sample payouts for the inside bet of roulette:

- **Straight Up** – This inside bet is a wager on a single number. Straight Up usually pays 35 to 1.
- **Basket Bet** – This is a five number bet on zero, double zero and number 1, 2 and 3. Basket Bet usually pays 6 to 1. However, on a double zero wheel, this inside bet has a house edge of 7.89 percent making the basket bet the worst bet in roulette.
- **Split Bet** – Just like straight up, this inside bet is a wager. However, this is a wager on two numbers and it pays 17 to 1. The player can make this bet by way of placing his or her chip so it straddles the line between any two numbers.
- **Street Bets or Line Bet** – This inside bet pays 11 to 1. You can make this bet by placing your chip on the vertical line, separating the outside and inside betting areas. The chip straddles the first number in the row.
- **Double Street Bet** – is another wager, but on six numbers. It pays 5 to 1. With this bet, you can place your chip on the line separating the outside and inside area as you do for the street bet, but let the chips straddle the row above or below.
- **Corner Bet or Quad Bet** – This is the inside bet which pays 8 to 1. You make this bet by placing a chip so it is touching the four corners of the numbers you are betting.

The Outside Bets

In the game of roulette, the outside bets are any of the bets made in the boxes surrounding the numbers. Here are the common outside bets:

- **Column Bets** – These bets are 12-number outside bets. However, instead of 12 consecutive number, they consist of the numbers in one of the three vertical columns. Also, column bets are made in the boxes at the bottom of the layout. These bets pay 2 to 1.
- **Red Black Odd and Even** – These outside bets are all even money bets. You make these bets by placing your chips in the boxes on the roulette layout.
- **The Dozens Bets** - Unlike the column bets, these outside bets are made on the 12 consecutive numbers. You make these bets by placing your wager in the boxes labeled 1 to 12, 13 to 24, or 25 to 36. And, just like the column, the dozens pay 2 to 1, and if the zero or double zero comes up, you lose the game.

Roulette Playing Tips

So, you've known the basics of roulette. The next thing to note now is that roulette has a high house edge but if you play at a full table, you will only obtain about 30 spins an hour. This, in return, slows down the time your money is exposed to the house edge. Also, it will increase your comp time.

If, for instance, the number you want to bet is covered with chips, you don't need to worry. It is allowable to stack your chips on top of the other chips. Well, this is actually another reason that each player of roulette has their own color chips.

In the game of roulette, you are further allowed to place bets after the dealer spins the ball. The dealer is the one required to keep the wheel moving at all

times, even between spins. The dealer then spins the ball in the opposite direction of the wheel, causing the ball to jump and spin before landing on a number. So, with these functions, the dealer is obliged to tell you when to stop. As the ball slows down, the dealer will wave his or her hand over the table and call out, "No More Bets". It is also the dealer who will mark the winning number with a marker. Note that you are not allowed to place your bet for the next spin until the dealer removes the marker from the previous winning number. So, before putting down your chips, wait for the dealer to pick the marked winning number.
